GTC Fellow Application 2012-2013 **(The application deadline is Monday April 2, 2012.)**

The Graduate Teaching Center (GTC) seeks talented graduate students to serve as GTC Fellows for the 2012-2013 academic year. GTC Fellows lead programs on effective teaching, develop teaching resources, and provide individual consultation for Teaching Fellows at Yale. GTC fellows work across disciplines as well as within their own departments, disciplines, and subject specialties.

The position begins on August 1st; all Fellows must be available to attend three days of training during the week beginning August 13. Throughout the semester, GTC Fellows devote on average 5-7 hours per week in the preparation and delivery of teaching services, for which they receive a semester stipend of \$2,700. In addition to carrying out their assigned activities, Fellows attend bi-weekly staff meetings during which they contribute to the direction and offerings of the Center.

This is an excellent opportunity for graduate students who would like to gain special expertise in college teaching, as well as experience mentoring and advising graduate students.

Applicants must be registered graduate students in good academic standing with at least one semester of Yale teaching experience. 1. A listing of your teaching experience, both formal and informal, to date
2. A brief (one page) assessment of your teaching strengths, strategies, and style
3. A representative sample of your teaching evaluations (we suggest the most recent)
4. A description of the teaching development activities (including GTC workshops and events) in which you have participated
5. In addition to providing our on-going programs, GTC Fellows develop new workshops and resources for teaching fellows. These initiatives are often aimed at a specific departments, disciplines, or topics. Please identify one aspect of teaching preparation that needs attention and describe a program or resource that you might develop to address it. (This may include a current program offered by the GTC that needs revision or redirection.)

We encourage you to submit additional documents in support of your teaching – a faculty letter, a peer observation report, a GTC observation report, etc. – but these are not required.
