FUNDING

\$60,000 per year for a period of 4 years. (Total: \$240,000)

NOMINATION LIMITATION

Yale University may nominate one candidate.

PURPOSE

This award is intended to provide assured support for young investigators of outstanding promise in science relevant to human health. Strong proposals will demonstrate particularly creative and innovative approaches. Risk-taking is encouraged. In evaluating applicants, considerable weight is given to evidence that the candidate is an independent investigator as shown by notable past accomplishments, including honors, awards, and significant published work.

ELIGIBILITY

- Individuals with the doctorate in medicine or biomedical sciences.
- As of November 1, 2011, candidates must hold full-time appointments at the rank of assistant professor or independent researcher on the faculty of the sponsoring institution.
- On July 1, 2012, they shall not have been in such an appointment for more than 3 years, whether or not such appointments were on a tenure track. This time may have been spent at more than 1 institution. Time spent in clinical internships, residencies, or in work toward board certification does not count as part of this 3-year limit.
- Scholars may not be supported simultaneously by similar privately-funded scholar awards in excess of \$50,000 during the first 2 years of the Pew Scholarship. NIH grants and K awards, faculty research awards, and grants from non-profit associations such as the American Cancer Society do not pose a conflict.
- Scholars are expected to spend at least 80% of their professional time conducting research, including the research outlined in the Pew proposal.
