FUNDING

Up to \$100,000 over 2 years as a salary supplement for the selected recipient. (Total: \$100,000)

NOMINATION LIMITATION

Yale University may nominate one candidate.

PURPOSE

This fellowship represents an opportunity for young investigators to spend 2 years of their career adding to the science of the amyloidoses. Applications for this fellowship are welcome from programs and institutions that focus on educating clinicians on the recognition, diagnosis and treatment of patients with amyloidosis, especially those of the hereditary/familial type.

The fellowship program is intended to support the career development of nurses, physicians and pharmacists. Proposals for fellowships should include research proposal focusing on patient care, patient and family education, and clinical and/or laboratory-based research within the respective discipline. At the conclusion of the fellowship, the recipients should be eligible for (board) certification in their respective disciplines and subspecialties. Special consideration will be given to institutions and programs that serve disadvantaged patient populations.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applications are submitted by senior faculty, division heads, or department chairs on behalf of a candidate to be named.
- Basic science and/or fundamental research (animal model, in-vivo/in-vitro) will not be funded.
- Prospective fellows must have the opportunity to carry out supervised research with the primary objective of preparing them for their respective discipline and subspecialty.
- The fellow selected must be a citizen or permanent resident of the US; hold an advanced degree (MD, DO, NP, PharmD, etc); and be enrolled in a fellowship program.
