FUNDING

Up to \$100,000 over 2 years as a salary supplement for the selected recipient. (Total: \$100,000)

NOMINATION LIMITATION

Yale University may nominate one candidate.

PURPOSE

The fellowship is intended to support research proposals for programs and initiatives that seek to uncover mechanisms for improving the organization, financing, and delivery of public health strategies that promote health and prevent disease and disability on a population-wide basis.

The Fellowship in Bioethics provides an opportunity for researchers to explore ethical issues that arise in the everyday practice of contemporary medicine. Institutions interested in this fellowship program should submit research proposals for programs and initiatives centered on issues such as doctor-patient confidentiality, genetic testing, stem cell research, professional boundaries, conflicts of interest, informed consent for treatment and research, and end-of-life care.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applications are submitted by senior faculty, division heads, or department chairs on behalf of a candidate to be named.
- Basic science and/or fundamental research (animal model, in-vivo/in-vitro) will not be funded.
- Prospective fellows must have the opportunity to carry out supervised research with the primary objective of preparing them for their respective discipline and subspecialty.
- The fellow selected must be a citizen or permanent resident of the US; hold an advanced degree (PhD, MD, DO, NP, PharmD, etc); and hold a non-tenured, junior faculty appointment.
