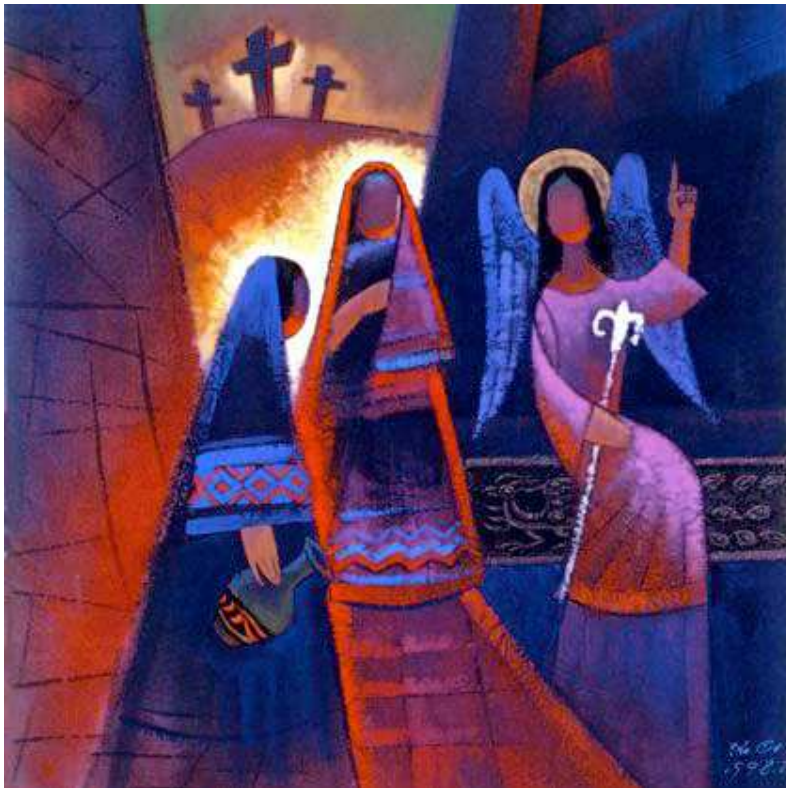
**Reminder:** *the last chapel service coincides with the last day of classes.*

This **Monday night at 7:00pm**, we will gather for our annual Easter Rejoicing service to usher in Eastertide. Please note that our worship service will not begin in the chapel, but around four separate locations **on the Quad** (weather permitting). You may find a clue on Monday morning about where to go, but if not, feel free to choose one of the following locations: Under the Sugar Maple by the Peace Pole (in case of rain, Commuter Lounge); Under the Magnolia Lilac, between Niebuhr and Admissions (in case of rain,

Niebuhr Hall); Near the Lana Schwebel Dogwood, between the administrative offices and the ISM practice rooms (in case of rain, Common Room); Under the Flowering Pear, near the Berkeley offices (in case of rain, LaTourette). Worship will begin at 7 PM in each of these locations.

Each year, the Easter Rejoicing service seeks to minister to the YDS community at the end of Holy Week, when many among us have been leading, processing, planning, singing, playing, and ministering to others non-stop for the past several days. This year, we will explore the many different ways we say "Alleluia!" and take to heart God's promise in Jeremiah, "*Again you shall take your tambourines, and go forth in the dance of the merry-makers*" (Jeremiah 31:4). As part of the Easter Rejoicing, we will be sharing a simple meal of bread and wine/juice, fruit, cheese and oil, so please leave a little room for the sharing of this meal in your supper plans!
