FELLOWSHIPS ADMINISTERED BY CIPE

Beinecke Scholarship

Supports two years of graduate study at a university in the U.S. or abroad for those aiming to pursue degrees in the arts, humanities, and social sciences

Eligible: U.S. citizens and nationals who are college juniors at the time of application

Chinese Cultural (Yung Wing) Scholarship

Supports one year at selected universities in China

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are not Chinese nationals

CIPE Research Fellowships for Juniors

Support summer research abroad that is related to senior essays and senior projects in the humanities and social sciences

Support U.S. government service summer internships at the federal, state, or local government level

Supports one year of public service abroad or in the United States. Please note: Students who will not have graduated upon undertaking their time abroad must take a leave of absence from the university.

Davis Projects for Peace

Support grassroots projects designed by individual students or groups that "promote peace and address the root causes of conflict among parties." Projects must take place over the summer following receipt of the award.

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors

Support one or two years of undergraduate study in the fields of mathematics, engineering, and natural sciences

Eligible: U.S. citizens, permanent residents, and nationals who are college sophomores or juniors

Parker Huang Undergraduate Travel Fellowship

Supports one year of study or work abroad in non-English-speaking countries. Please note: Students who will not have graduated upon undertaking their time abroad must take a leave of absence from the university.

Eligible: Yale sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are U.S. citizens

Richard U. Light Fellowship

Supports one term or one year of language study at approved sites in East Asia

John Thouron Prize

Supports an eight-week summer program at Pembroke College of the University of Cambridge

Eligible: U.S. citizens and permanent residents who are sophomores or juniors at Yale, Harvard, and the Univ. of Pennsylvania

Harry S. Truman Scholarships

Provide mentorship and up to \$30,000 to students pursuing graduate degrees in public service fields

Eligible: college juniors who are U.S. citizens and nationals

Campus deadline: November 11, 2011

National Security Education program / David L. Boren Scholarship

Supports study abroad outside of Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand. Appropriate and integrated study of a foreign language is required. Study abroad programs of one year are preferred, but summer programs will be considered for students in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) fields.

Eligible: college freshmen, sophomores, and juniors who are U.S. citizens

The Udall Scholarship

Support one year of undergraduate study for those students with demonstrated interest in fields related to the environment and for students of Native American or Alaska Native heritage who are pursuing careers in tribal public policy or health care

Eligible: college sophomores and juniors who are U.S. citizens, nationals, and permanent residents

Shana Alexander Research Fellowship in Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies – Supports summer research projects related to women's, gender, and sexuality studies

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors.

Bildner Fellowship in Contemporary and Historical Jewish Life in Israel and the Diaspora - Supports summer and term-time study, work, research, and projects in the U.S. and abroad lasting at least 8 weeks and related to Judaic studies, the study of Hebrew and Yiddish, anti-Semitism studies, and related fields. For projects during term-time, students must take a leave of absence from the university.

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Wendy E. Blanning Memorial Summer Fellowship – Supports summer internships, projects, and other pre-professional activities in the U.S. and abroad

Eligible: Yale sophomores and juniors who receive financial aid

CIPE Spanish and Latin American Fellowships – Support summer and term-time projects, internships, research, and study abroad in Latin America and Spain. Activity must last at least 8 weeks, except in the case of study abroad programs of shorter duration. For non-study activity during term-time, students must take a leave of absence from the university.
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

CIPE Summer Journalism Fellowships – Support CIPE summer projects and internships related to all fields of journalism (e.g., print, photo, broadcast)
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Cohen Summer Public Service Fellowship – Supports summer public service projects abroad and in the United States lasting at least 8 weeks.
Eligible: Yale juniors

Robert Lyons Danly 1969 Memorial Travel Fellowship – Supports summer research in Japan, with a preference for students whose studies have demonstrated a focus on Japan (including, but not limited to, language study).
Eligible: U.S. citizens who are Yale freshmen, sophomores, or juniors

Jehiel R. Elyachar Foundation Travel Fellowship – Supports summer research lasting at least 8 weeks related to Judaic studies. Projects focusing on anti-Semitism are not eligible.
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Franciscus Summer Travel Fellowship in Entrepreneurship – Supports summer projects and internships lasting at least 8 weeks that are entrepreneurial in nature and take place away from New Haven (in the U.S. or abroad)
Eligible: Yale juniors

Friedman Family Travel/Research Fellowship – Supports summer research projects related to urban development in the U.S. or abroad, with a preference for projects in developing countries. Also supports unpaid jobs and internships abroad related to urban studies; jobs and internships in the U.S. will only be considered if there is a significant research component. Summer activity must last at least 5 weeks.
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores and juniors

GALA Summer Fellowship – Supports unpaid internships lasting at least 6 weeks with non-profit organizations focusing on political, economic, social, or cultural issues that affect lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer individuals
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors

Alexander P. Hixon Fellowship – Supports international students pursuing summer travel within the U.S. for research, independent projects, or internships lasting at least 6 weeks
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores and juniors who are not U.S. citizens

William & Miriam Horowitz and David & Iris Fischer Judaica Project Funds – Support summer activities (e.g., research, art, film, study, theater, writing) that will increase the understanding of Jewish history, culture, or religious thought in a demonstrable way.
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and graduate students

Charles H. Siegel Traveling Fellowships – Support summer research lasting at least 8 weeks in locations east of the Caspian Sea, excluding China, Japan, Korea, & Taiwan
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Solomon Research Fellowship in LGBT Studies – Supports summer research in sexuality studies, especially in lesbian, gay, bisexual, and/or transgender studies
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Summer Fellowships in Japan – Support summer research, projects, and internships in Japan
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Sunrise Foundation Travel Grant – Supports internships, research, and projects lasting at least 8 weeks in “emerging market” countries (see Student Grants Database for eligible countries)
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Julia Vance and Jason Carter Travel Fellowship – Supports summer or term-time research or internships in the U.S. or abroad related to engineering. Activity must last at least 8 weeks, with the exception of projects sponsored by the Yale chapter of Engineers without Borders. For projects during term-time, students must take a leave of absence from the university.
Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Yale College Public Service Research Grant – Supports volunteer and public service projects in the U.S. and abroad that include a research component. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, those focused on the environment and social justice.

Eligible: Yale sophomores and juniors

Yale College Dean's Research Fellowship in the Humanities & Social Sciences – Supports original undergraduate research projects lasting 8-10 weeks in the U.S. or abroad that are conducted under the supervision of a Yale University faculty member.

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Art Museum Scholar Summer Internships

Support summer internships of at least 8 weeks at art museums abroad or in the U.S., including the Yale Center for British Art and the Yale University Art Gallery

Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships

Support academic year and summer language programs abroad at the intermediate or advanced level. Proposed language of study must be designated as a priority by the Department of Education. Refer to the Student Grants Database for a list.

Eligible: U.S. citizens and permanent residents

Deadline: Exact deadlines vary by subject, but are all in the spring semester. Refer to the Student Grants Database.

Arthur Liman Public Interest Summer Fellowship Program

Support undergraduates by providing placement in and stipends for summer internships focused on public interest law

Eligible: all undergraduates from Yale, Barnard, Brown, Harvard, Princeton, and Spelman Universities

Supports internships and projects of personal educational value or humanitarian service to others

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Supports summer internships, research, and formal study abroad

Support one year of study or work abroad in countries that have strained relations with the United States (see Student Grants Database for eligible countries)

Richter Summer Fellowship

Supports summer research, independent study, and internships that have a significant study/research component

Chase Coggins Memorial Fund

Supports summer wilderness exploration with philosophical, scientific, or artistic intent and travel to rural areas or developing countries for research/independent study

Eligible: Yale freshmen, sophomores, and juniors

Josephine de Karman Fellowship Trust

Supports one year of undergraduate study in any discipline

Eligible: juniors of any nationality at U.S. institutions

Supports up to a year of study abroad in any discipline

Glamour Magazine's Top Ten College Women Competition

Winners participate in a fully-funded nine-week summer program in New York City that provides experience with media corporations and introduces students to industry professionals.

National Defense Education Program's SMART Scholarship

Supports an undergraduate or graduate degree in a wide range of areas (including mathematics, engineering, cognitive science, biology, chemistry, and physics) at a U.S. institution and provides mentorship and summer internships. Upon degree completion, awardees are employed through the Department of Defense as civilian researchers.

Eligible: undergraduates who are U.S. citizens

Overseas Press Club Foundation Scholarships and Internships

Provide scholarships and internships to young journalists aspiring to be foreign correspondents
