#### DIRECTIONS:

**Guilford and East:** I-95 to Exit 54, Cedar Street. Turn left off exit ramp then right at second traffic light onto US 1. Go under railroad bridge, turn left onto CT 142 (Short Beach Road). At the stop sign (Clark Ave.) turn left. YCYC is just past the beach on the left.

**New Haven and West:** I-95 to Exit 51, Frontage Road. Turn right at second traffic light onto CT 142 (Hemmingway Ave.). At third traffic light (Shell station) turn left onto Short Beach Road. At the stop sign (Clark Ave.) turn right. YCYC is just past the beach on the left.

**Public Buses:** Connecticut Transit buses depart from Chapel Street between Temple and Church Streets. Take the F bus (Branford via East Haven Route) to Clark Avenue. For time schedules, call 624-0151.

**The Yale Corinthian Yacht Club (YCYC)** is a sailing facility for the Yale Community and general public. Located in Short Beach in Branford, Connecticut, YCYC is home to the Yale Sailing Team, and is the nation's oldest collegiate sailing organization, dating back to 1881. Renovated in 2002, the club now offers a fleet of 24 420's (a 14-foot sailing dingy). Based in Short Beach Cove, a well-protected inlet of Long Island Sound, YCYC offers a safe and fun learning environment for sailors of all levels, and makes learning a breeze.

**YCYC SUMMER MEMBERSHIP** includes summer sailing from starting date, June 21 –August 13\* during open sailing hours (M–F 1pm–7:30pm, S–S 10am–7:00pm), free guest privileges, entrance in weekly racing series and regattas, opportunities to enter US Sailing Association championships, and regular social events such as cookouts and informal regattas with neighboring yacht clubs.

YCYC offers group lessons for both adults and kids. Weekend lessons for adults are taught throughout the summer, and more experienced sailors may enjoy the excitement of sailing on Long Island Sound.

As always, YCYC offers top-of-the-line junior instruction. Beginner, intermediate, and advanced junior sailors will enjoy learning from our experienced staff of top collegiate sailors, who led YCYC juniors to competitive finishes in the ECSA team racing championship and ECSA all-star regatta last summer. Under the guidance of coach Bill Healy, a former collegiate All-American, YCYC continues an excellent program for juniors aged 9–18 of all abilities.

## LESSONS AND INSTRUCTION

**ADULT LESSONS** are taught to the beginner and intermediate/advanced in 420's. Class sizes are limited to ensure close interactions with the instructors, so please register early.

### **420 Level 1, Sat & Sun 10am–4pm**

A two-day intensive class for beginning sailors providing 10 hours of teaching from two instructors, including chalk board explanations, sailing demonstrations, and on-the-water instruction. Students will learn the basics of sailing: rigging, launching, basic maneuvering, capsizing and rescue, and landing. After this class, students will be able to enjoy sailing and the open waters on their own.

### **Learn to Race, Mon & Wed 5:30–7:30pm**

Designed for sailors who have completed the Level 1 class or have had comparable sailing experience. As conditions allow, the course will feature advanced theories of sailing, light- or heavy-air sailing techniques, advanced steering techniques, and an introduction to racing.

**THE JUNIOR PROGRAM** is offered to students aged 9–18 in two 4-week sessions. Classes meet for 3 hours each day, Monday through Friday. YCYC offers four levels of instruction to properly suit different ages and abilities.

Session I: June 21–July 16\*

Session II: July 19–August 13

\*YCYC will be closed on Monday, July 5. Single handling is not allowed unless by permission.

### **420 Beginner, Mon thru Fri, 9am–12pm**

Offered to children with no prior sailing experience. It emphasizes safety and teaches basic sailing skills as outlined in the Level 1 420 class. This includes knowledge of boat, rigging, launching, basic sailing, water safety and confidence in handling all points of sail.

### **420 Intermediate, Mon thru Fri, 9am–12pm**

Teaches kids who are knowledgeable in basic sailing skills improved boat handling, and provides an introduction to racing. The curriculum is an extension of the Beginner class with an emphasis upon independence in rigging, skippering, and boat safety.

### **420 Advanced, Mon thru Fri, 1pm–4pm**

Meant for sailors with a general comfort level in most aspects of sailing, the Advanced class focuses on refining basic skills in boat handling, sail trim, and racing. Students will often practice with the higher classes and will gain experience with a more serious level of sailing not presented in the Beginner and Intermediate classes.

### **420 Racing Team, Mon thru Fri, 1pm–4pm**

The Racing Team continues the racing instruction begun in the intermediate class and learns advanced tactics and strategy, starting, sail trim, sail shape, boat setup, and advanced boat handling in practices run by our racing coach. The racing team will participate in junior racing clinics and will enter and compete in local regattas against other yacht clubs.
